CHILDREN'S SUNDAY SCHOOL (Preschool-5th grades) We meet in the room across from the nursery at 9 a.m. We are using Growing in Grace and Gratitude curriculum, which is rooted in the foundation of Presbyterian identity where God's grace and our gratitude are the heartbeat of our faith, life, and worship. The classes inspire children to learn and practice hospitality, generosity, and love; and reaches beyond Sunday morning, encouraging children to live their lives as an expression of God's grace.

WORSHIP EXPLORERS! After the children's message and during the sermon, children **Preschool-4th grades** can follow a Worship Explorers leader to a classroom. This program is designed to help children grow as worshipers and to equip them to participate in worship. The children will be out of worship only during the sermon. 5th grade and up should stay in the sanctuary to listen to the sermon.

WEDNESDAY NIGHTS @ CEDAR HEIGHTS (WN@CH) is a family dinner around the table in Fellowship Hall from 6:00-6:30 p.m. After dinner, children and youth go to age-specific activities and are invited to participate in faith-based discussion. At this time, parents clean up the kitchen and dining room together, and gather after to discuss family life, which often circles around to faith related topics. Activities finish by 7:30 p.m. We will continue with families signing up to cook the meal each week, a sign-up sheet will be provided in Fellowship Hall. Please join us!

PUBLIC SKATING INFORMATION AND TIPS

- Dress appropriately! The rink is chilly—don't forget your sweatshirt or coat. Helmets (hockey or bicycle), elbow & knee pads are strongly recommended but not required. Gloves are a good idea as well, along with long pants and one pair of socks that come above the ankle.
- Skates must be worn at all times on the ice! No shoes on the ice!
- They do not have doubled-bladed skates or skate aids/walkers to assist beginning skaters.
- NO carrying of young children while skating.

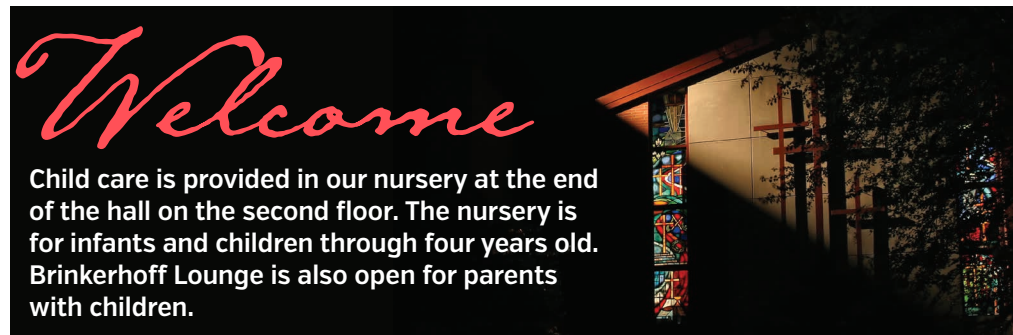
