PASTOR'S CHEMOTHERAPY & WORK PATTERNS: Pastor Dave has been diagnosed with testicular cancer, a highly curable type of cancer. His 4th of four cycles begins Monday, May 12. A cycle includes treatments Monday through Friday in week one, followed by 2 weeks off for a total of 12 weeks. He plans to continue his work to the best of his ability with some adaptations. He will be keeping safe distances throughout his chemo. This means no in person church or community meetings and no pastoral visits. He will try to stay in touch by phone, text and email. On Sunday mornings, Dave will remain in his office before and after worship and will limit his movement during the service to the pulpit area. Worshipers are encouraged to wear masks, esp. those who sit closer to the front. Thank you for your understanding, your patience and your prayers. "For everything there is a season ..." RESTOCKING THE SUNDAY SUPPER PANTRY 2025–MAY 4 THROUGH MAY 20
The Sunday Supper pantry shelves need to be refilled again this spring. Basic staples relied on every week by the cooks are needed. Food brought to CHCPC will be transported to First Presbyterian Church, Waterloo. Cash donations are wonderful! Lesley Johnson, head cook, with suggestions of other cooks, prepared this list of needs: cans of fruit and vegetables-large #10 cans preferred; bottles of olive oil; containers of chicken or beef stock, sugar, salt, pepper, pork & chicken rubs or seasonings, mayonnaise, large bottles of ranch and other common salad dressings; Kool-Aid or Lemonade Mix 19 oz size, non-dairy creamer shelf-stable, and coffee. Paper products: 9 oz Styrofoam cups, 55-gallon garbage bags, paper towels, and napkins. The Food Drive will be May 4-20 during the Easter Season. Please leave items in the Food Bank box at the top of the stairs. Turn in any cash gifts to the church office or in the collection plate.
