NEXT STEPS FOR PASTORAL TRANSITION: Now that the congregation has voted to accept the session's recommendation to have Pastor Johnny succeed Pastor Dave at the beginning of June, we wanted to share what comes next. The Presbytery of North Central Iowa has called a special meeting of the presbytery (to be conducted via Zoom) on Tuesday, June 2 (precise time TBD). CHCPC's succession plan must receive 75% or more of voting commissioners present for this presbytery gathering. Presbytery leadership has indicated a great confidence that this vote will meet the necessary threshold. Once presbytery has voted to approve CHCPC's succession plan, the presbytery will partner with CHCPC to schedule a service of installation, installing Johnny as the senior pastor and head of staff.

- May 27** - Bike Ride, 6:30 p.m. leaving from Pfeiffer Park, meeting up for ice cream at The Vibe

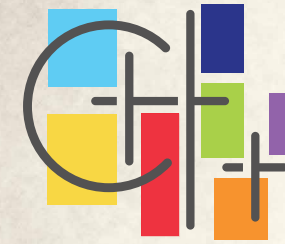

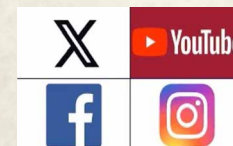
